BRIGHTON LODGE #366 CELEBRATES WITH MEMORIAL

On November 22, Members of Brighton Lodge # 366 met at the Brighton Cemetery to dedicate a monument to all the past and present members of the Brighton Lodge.

Brighton Lodge was organized on March 5, 1868. Many good citizens of the town made their way through the degrees and worked to improve the lives of their fellow citizens in the town.

In 1905, a large two story building was purchased with loan assistance from Western Star Lodge in Alton, for \$1,200.00. The downstairs floor was rented out until 1950 to the publishers of the Brighton News. After the News left, that floor was renovated and it became a social hall for the members and Rebekahs.

A few years ago, Rail Road workers were working on the Rail Road behind the lodge when a bulldozer 'accidently' bumped into the building causing it to fall down.

The Lodge now meets in Alton.

Brighton Odd Fellow Lodge was organized on March 5, 1868. The First Trustees were G Compton, J. Howell, T. L. Keas, G.L. Bean, L.P. Armstrong.

Early Rules were office fines for being absent, elected officers were fined .25 cents, appointed officers were fined .15 cents. The lodge was located in various halls in Brighton for many years.

An issue came to head on December 8 1873. The issue was spitting tobacco juice on the stove. The men were fined .50 cents

and urged to bring their own spittoons.

Our lodge hall at 109 N. Main Street was purchased in 1905, for \$1200.00. The down stairs was rented until 1950 to the Publishers of the Brighton News. After the News moved out of the downstairs, it was refurbished and painted, new ceiling, shelves removed and it looked good. It was rented for a couple of years and then the lodge used it as their dinning room, Our Rebekah lodge #686 ladies were so happy to have a nice room to entertain guests. They kept it clean

and always looking nice.

Many improvements to the hall were made through the years, tuck-pointing, furnaces, new brick front, rest room, and as usual our Rebekah Lodge was our great helpers worked tirelessly to maintain and improve our hall and made many donations.

Our most important project to our members and surrounding area residents was our Hospital Equipment, this project was sponsored and money raised to buy some equipment by the Odd Fellows and Rebekahs.

Our local Dr F.N. Orr and our Pharmacist Mr Gross, would refer people to the Lodge. Our equipment was always in use. Some folks would give a donation, and some donated additional hospital equipment. We started with three beds and ended with eight, and many wheel chairs.

The Odd Fellow Membership in the best days were from the 1800's through the 1920's. The great depression of the 30's saw a considerable loss in membership. After World War II we had a good increase in membership of 20, even though the ladies can now join the Odd

My project for several years was to get a monument in memory of all Odd Fellows and Rebekahs.

The Brighton Cemetery Boar was gracious to grand us permission to place the monument here by the G.A.R. and Veterans Monuments. Hundreds of Odd Fellows and Rebekahs are buried here in the surrounding cemeteries.

Today we dedicate this monument to their memories.


